Caption	including Introduction, a full description of what can be seen and a background - information to illustrate.	<p>The settlement at New Lanark dates from 1785 when it was founded as a cotton-manufacturing centre, harnessing the natural energy of the Falls of Clyde. By 1820, the population of the village was around 2,500 and there were four mills in production. The village has survived into the 21st century with remarkably few changes, and is nominated as a World Heritage Site.</p> <p>This view shows New Lanark in its landscape setting, with farmland bordering the village to the east. Mantilla Row, which was demolished in 1988 can still be seen. The footpath linking the village to the remote car park on the hillside above can be seen above New Buildings. The external brick staircase on the eastern gable of the Institute was later demolished when the building was restored in the late 1980s. During restoration, the gable ends of Braxfield Row, Caithness Row and Nursery Buildings were harled because of the poor quality of the stonework.</p> <p>The New Lanark Conservation Trust was formed in 1974 with the object of restoring and revitalising the historic village. By the end of the 20th century, this remarkable project was nearing completion, and the achievements of the Trust recognised by numerous prestigious awards, notably a Europa Nostra Medal of Honour and a Best Practice Award from the British Urban Regeneration Association.</p>
